- **-Charm Necklaces (Carla Buxton)** They were used last year for 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> grade for AR incentives. This year, they will be used as well for those grades for that but also for the whole school for holiday parties and teachers were encouraged to use their room allotment money for their classroom. Other committees may use their funds to also purchase them for the kids.

- -HomeRoom Parent, SpiritWear, yearbook & STEM Grant (Colleen Jesko) This year, lead homeroom parents will need to attend 4 PTA meetings. Lead homeroom parent and those helping is scheduled for next PTA meeting, Thursday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, immediately following PTA meeting. Spiritwear will begin the day of Open House and hopefully, will have items to display to order. We plan to have "flash" sales for Halloween and Christmas this year as well. Colleen applied for \$1,000 STEM grant and will know if we won on September r15th. The money will be used for a STEM mathematics family night. Yearbook will be \$15 this year. #### Volunteers

  - Ticket Sales We will have 250 Horse tickets to sell IT'S CRUCIAL THAT WE SELL TICKETS TO PEOPLE THAT WILL COME TO THE EVENT, THIS WILL HELP US RAISE MORE MONEY. SOMEONE THAT IS NOT THERE CAN'T SPEND MORE MONEY
  - Food Working with Beyond Parsley to get the menu perfected ..... Menu is looking like, Chicken, Meatballs, Sausage, Penne Pasta, Salad, Bread, Butter and Desserts (Can add another veggie if there's a big desire)
  - Dessert Is this something Rachel would like to handle by herself? Or should
     I get more volunteers. It can be simple like two cakes, cookies or pies
  - Drinks Looking to purchase pop for \$0.25/Can (\$6/24 case) Water Bottles from Costco or Sam's

#### During Event

- Set Up We will need at least 5-10 volunteers for setup, this includes set up of chairs, tables, food, raffle and ticket stations
- Entrance
  - Horse Tickets (1 volunteer) These will be the tickets that were presold prior to the event. Those that didn't purchase a horse ticket may pay \$10 at the door. \$10 will get them entrance, food, drink and access to purchase raffle and betting tickets
  - Betting Tickets (1 volunteer) Betting tickets will be sold throughout the night, you have to purchase this ticket prior to betting on the horses
  - ❖ 50/50 Tickets (1-2 volunteers) We will sell 50/50 tickets at the entrance as well as around the tables during the event
  - ❖ Raffle Tickets (1 volunteer) raffle tickets will be sold for the first half of the event. Tickets will be pulled during races to switch things up a bit
- Bar Tenders (1-2 volunteers) Everyone should be over 21 at this event but I still need someone to monitor people getting drinks so things don't get out of hand
- **Food (1-4 volunteers)** these volunteers will be needed to make sure everything is kept hot and replenish items.
- Betting Windows (10 volunteers) I will need ten volunteers to take bets throughout the night, 5 for the first half of the races and 5 for the second half

(THEY WILL NOT WORK THE WHOLE THING) It's extremely easy, they will be given a piece of paper that has numbers on it... all they will have to do is circle what horse the person is betting on. That's it!

Elimination Card Game (1-4 volunteers) - This is a game that goes on during the first and second half of the races. The volunteers will need to walk

around to everyone trying to sell cards.

 Tab Tickets (1-4 volunteers, can be the same as the Elimination Card game volunteers) - Volunteers will walk around selling tab tickets to guests for another chance for them to win money

Clean Up (5-10 Volunteers) – volunteers will hope clean up food, takes

down tables and chairs and mop the floor
