Meeting was called order and all in attendance were welcomed by President Carla Buxton at 2:05pm in the art room.

Treasurers report: $\$ 11,000$ before NATR and after making a deposit from NATR it is now $\$ 22,4000$. NATR deposit was $\$ 6,999.45$, Hoagies $\$ 1,727.00$, Paint night $\$ 971$, Spirit wear $\$ 392$

A motion to approve the Treasurers Report and the October meeting minutes was made by Cortney Hall and $2^{\text {nd }}$ by Rachel Woolsey. Motion carried.

## Committee Reports

Fundraising, NATR and food Sales was discussed by Brittany Enders. 240 tickets for the NATR were sold, 198 people were in attendance, there were 20 tickets purchased at the door. There was over $\$ 600$ for the 50/50 raffle, 23 baskets raffled. We will be getting back $\$ 90$ for unused beer and pop. For the Hoagie sale, 457 items were sold between hoagies and pepperoni rolls. Next is the Zroni pepperoni roll sale with order forms due back Friday November $3^{\text {rd }}$ and the pickup on Tuesday November $21^{\text {st }}$. After that will be the freezer raffle and 2 other hoagie sales January $24^{\text {th }}$ - Feb $5^{\text {th }}$ with delivery Feb $16^{\text {th }}$ and April $4-16^{\text {th }}$ with delivery April $26^{\text {th }}$. Camille Houy spoke about Fill your Freezer fundraiser, tickets are printed and will be distributed. Tickets are $\$ 10$ each with 4 chances to win based on lottery on Jan $15^{\text {th }}, 16^{\text {th }} 17^{\text {th }}$ and $18^{\text {th }}$. Pork on the $15^{\text {th }}$ worth $\$ 100$, Beef on the $16^{\text {th }}$ worth $\$ 150,1 / 2$ pig on the $17^{\text {th }}$ worth $\$ 200$ and $1 / 3$ beef and freezer chest on the $18^{\text {th }}$ worth $\$ 350-\$ 400$. We need to sell 1,000 tickets, there will be a ticket order sheet to keep track of tickets sold. There will be dates set up for people to purchase tickets. Tickets will need to be paid for first before taking. We will make $\$ 8500-\$ 9000$ if all tickets are sold.
$4^{\text {th }}$ grade send off was discussed by Rachel Woolsey. There was a meeting last week. They discussed having it somewhere other than the independence fire hall because the class has a lot of boys and they don't know how entertained they would be there. They are calling to YMCA to get info for swimming and using the gym there etc. Also they will need to get info about bussing the kids there. They have sold 6 cases of candy bars. They will be selling pizza, edible cookie dough and candy bars at the Author night. They are also hosting a swim party Friday Nov $3^{\text {rd }}$. They are getting pizza for it but are undecided where it will be from. There will also be a Pittsburgh Penguins ticket raffle soon. Colleen Jesko is donating 2 tickets for this, more info to come.

AR was discussed by Cortney Hall. The party is on Nov $20^{\text {th }}$ and she needs volunteers to help, she will be sending an email out with more info. She is thinking of a superhero theme and will need help cutting pieces for the craft. There are 59 kids from the upper hall and 32 from the lower hall.

Author night was discussed by Melissa Hosack. She has 3 authors coming to read and do activities. One is bringing her cat that goes with the story. $4^{\text {th }}$ grade will be selling pizza. There will also be a raffle basket. It's on Nov $16^{\text {th }} 6-8$ and you need to RSVP. They will be decorating right after school or if you can come early to help finish. Flyers will be distributed with the info. Some of the extra nonalcoholic drinks from NATR with be there and popcorn. The authors are donating books to make a basket raffle.

Yearbook was discussed by Amanda Brunton. Please take photos and send them in. Everyone was also reminded to check with Ms Nancy or the teacher for the kids who cannot have their photos taken.

Rebates were discussed but Jamie Cutright. 1,987 box tops were turned in. We get $\$ 198.70$ back. The app has gotten us $\$ 157.20$. There is $\$ 355.90$ total in box top rebates. There will be a March movie contest.

Hanging of the Greens was discussed by Carla Buxton. This is for parents only, no class parties this day. Just the PTA decorating. Melissa Hosack is donating a new regular sized tree. Any decorating ideas can be shared with Carla. She is thinking of a silver and blue theme. Maybe hanging garland snowflakes. Will look at condition of the snowflakes and throw out the old tree.

Holiday Paint night was discussed by Bree Malackanich. It will be on Dev $8^{\text {th }} 7-9 \mathrm{pm}$ at Raccoon Fire Hall. \$35 and 8 different designs of burlap door hangers. RSVP with the design that you want. You may bring your own snacks and drinks. A flyer from Artsy doodle with be coming home soon.

Santa's workshop was discussed by Tammy Holland. A company is coming to supply the items. They will cost from $\$ 0.25$ up to $\$ 4-5$. The company will bring everything. No $\$$ up front, no inventory. We will get a check for $10 \%$ of what is sold. It will be in Dec $8^{\text {th }}, 11^{\text {th }}$ and $12^{\text {th }}$. There will be 4 classes the first day, 4 the $2^{\text {nd }}$ day and 3 the $3^{\text {rd }}$ day allowing more time for each class. There will be a sign-up sheet to help and a teacher schedule. Tax will not be charged on the items sold.

Since there is no meeting scheduled for January, Carla suggested having one and there will be a poll set up on Facebook for when to have it. Evening, afternoon and what day.

Game night was discussed by Kerri Biesenkamp. There will be one on Jan $25^{\text {th }}$. It is a free event and there will be popcorn and drinks.
